

HHS 2014 AP Results Data Points to Consider

School-wide

- Our pass rate held steady (30.5 in 2013, 30.7 in 2014) but our percentage of 1s dropped (39.1 in 2013, 36.2 in 2014)
- The number of exams taken increased from 233 in 2013 to 254 in 2014

Participation

- The following courses saw a significant increase in students taking the course: English Language (22 students), English Literature (20 students), Psychology (16 kids)
- The following courses saw drops in enrollment: Calculus, Microeconomics, US Government

Performance

- Awesome results: Calculus (75 percent passing), English Language (up 15.6 points over last year), Spanish Language, US History (Yay Pingley!), World History (up 12.7 points over 2013)
- English Literature (17.9 percent passing), Human Geography (11.1 percent passing),
 Microeconomics (10 percent passing), Psychology (21.4 percent passing), US Government (16.7 percent passing)

Needs

- We have a number of new teachers to AP, as well as a number of new AP courses. Eeek!
- I would like to facilitate an opportunity for teachers to sit and take their exams (or closely study their exams), and then teach their vertical teams what skills are necessary for each exam. Are there resources to support that kind of training?
- I would like to build capacity of ALL students to complete the AP-like tasks, which means giving regular education teachers some skills and strategies to use in their classrooms. Is there anything available to help me with that?
- What kind of participation and performance results should we be shooting for next year?
